STUDENT MODELLING POLICY

Introduction

This policy provides a clear framework for all students and will lead to greater consistency. This will ultimately result in more positive behaviour for learners as they often emulate or copy peers.

Appearance/dress

Learners are required to wear a smart school uniform and to dress appropriately for learning activities.

Footwear must be appropriate to the business environment/ activity and conform to HSE guidelines for reducing trips and slips in the workplace.

Footwear must be of an enclosed shoe construction. Steel toe capped boots, canvas plimsolls, flimsy ballet style shoes, 'Flip flop' type open footwear is unacceptable.

Overcoats should be of simple design without large motifs or logos.

Organisation

Learners are expected to have a school bag containing equipment for learning and a School Planner.

Attendance and punctuality

Learners are expected to be on time for school, registration/assembly and all lessons.

Relationships/interaction with others

Learners are expected to be polite to each other, staff and visitors. They are expected to use appropriate language when speaking to others, particularly with regards to race equality and gender.

Security/safety

Learners are expected to act in a responsible and safe manner at all times – in lessons, as they move around the school and during fire drills. All learners must wear an ID badge.

The school and learning environment

Learners should contribute to maintaining an attractive and tidy learning environment and never damage buildings, furniture or equipment. They must put litter in bins.

Mobile phones/Electronic Devices

Learners should not bring mobile phones or other personal electronic equipment to school. The school will take no liability for such equipment.

Eating and drinking

Students are encouraged to use the school catering facilities and only to drink water. They must not chew gum on the school site.

Hair, Body Art and Piercings

Students are not allowed to have extreme haircuts or colours. Hair colouring where applied should fall within the natural spectrum of hair colour. Body art and body piercings should not be visible.

Smoking is illegal on the school site.
